## **Are you ready for ICD-10?**

It's true! Effective **October 1, 2015**, the health industry will transition from ICD-9 to ICD-10 codes for diagnoses and inpatient procedures. This means everyone covered by HIPAA must use ICD-10 codes for health care services provided on or after October 1, 2015.

Things you need to know:

- Claims must now include the ICD Indicator.
- Claims for dates of service prior to October 1, 2015 must be submitted with an ICD-9 code and an ICD Indicator of 9.
- Claims for dates of service on or after October 1, 2015 must be submitted with an ICD-10 code and ICD Indicator of 0.
- Claims that crossover between September, 2015 and October, 2015 must be split when billed and accompany the appropriate diagnosis.
- Claims billed with incorrect diagnosis codes will be rejected/denied.
